	Why Be a Christian?	
	The apostle Paul gave us some wonderful motives for anyone to become a Christian in Romans chapter 8. Quite often, people will ask, "Why should I be a Christian? What's in it	
GNMENTS	for me?" Besides salvation; redemption; justification; and fellowship with God, Christ, and the Holy Spirit, Paul gives several other points in Romans 8.	
MARCH 3, 2024 David O'Connell David Wilbanks	pronounced with the suggestion of punishment to follow" (Vine's Expository Dictionary of New Testament Words). Paul had already affirmed in Romans that all had sinned (3:23)	

Second, Paul tells us that the Christian is freed from the law of sin and death (vs. 2-3). The "law of sin" is the rule of sin in one's life. Paul had earlier told the Roman brethren how sin could rule a person's life (Romans 6:12-14). Jesus said that whoever sinned was the slave of sin (John 8:34). While a Christian can never claim sinless perfection (I John 1:8-10), he refuses to let sin control his life. This is the basic difference in the Christian and non-Christian in regard to sin.

Third, the Christian is blessed with life and peace (vs. 6). The Christian has the abundant life (John 10:10). With this abundant life comes a purpose for living, hope in the afterlife. confidence in one's relationship with God, and a joyful attitude. All of this is possible because the Christian has peace with God (Romans 5:1).

Fourth, the Christian is a child of God (vs. 14-18). One of the great privileges of being a child of God is being able to converse with God in prayer (I John 4:14). John also says that it is an honor to be called the sons of God (I John 3:1).

Why be a Christian? To escape condemnation, to be free from the law of sin, to have life and peace, and to become a child of God.

How does one become a Christian? By believing in Jesus as God's Son (John 8:24), by repenting of his sins (Acts 2:38), by confessing one's faith in Christ (Acts 8:37), and being baptized in water for the remission of his sins (Matthew 28:19,20; Mark 16:16; Acts 2:38). These are the steps to make one a Christian and to give one the blessings of Romans 8.
