The Godly and the Wicked - A Vivid Contrast

Psalm 1 is a vivid contrast between the blessings of the righteous man and the condition of the unrighteous.

In verses one through three of this psalm, David describes the happiness of the godly man. The writer begins with several negative and positive characteristics of the righteous individual. Negatively, the upright person does not "walk in the counsel of the ungodly, nor stand in the way of sinners, nor sits in the seat of the scornful (scoffers)." Basically, the writer is saying that "evil companions corrupt good morals" (I Corinthians 15:33). Positively, the holy person "delights in the law of the Lord," and he meditates on this law day and night. This reminds us of the Bereans who "searched the Scriptures daily" (Acts 17:11). We should also remember that in regard to sound teaching, Paul told Timothy to "meditate on these things" (I Timothy 4:15).

The psalmist states that the godly man is like a tree planted by a well-watered place (vs. 3). His leaves are always green, and his fruit comes out in season. This is saying that the righteous prosper under God's blessings and care.

The psalmist next describes the ungodly in verses four and five. The wicked are like chaff which the wind blows away. They have no security and mooring like the well-watered tree. They are "tossed about by every wind of doctrine" (Ephesians 4:14). These unstable people will not be acquitted in the judgment nor be able to stand among the righteous (vs. 5). The psalm concludes that the way of the unrighteous is to perish (vs. 6).

The contrast between the godly and the ungodly in this psalm should motivate all of us to examine our hearts, repent if necessary, and make our lives as close as possible to the godly man in Psalm 1.
