The Proper Order of Things

Jesus stated: "But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you" (Matthew 6:33). There are many lessons we can learn from this verse.

By using the word "first," Jesus recognizes that there are several areas of life that are vying for one's time and attention. There are our jobs, our homes, community activities, education, hobbies, and church. It is obvious that some things are going to be a priority, while other things have to wait. Our Lord knew that, while on earth, every person will have to make choices of what is really important.

Certainly, we need to choose the kingdom of God above earthly treasures and luxuries. Jesus had spoken about material things being corrupted, disintegrating, or being stolen (Matthew 6:19-21). Jesus also said that we cannot serve God and mammon (Matthew 6:24). This coincides with Paul's exhortation to the Colossian brethren to "set your affection on things above, not on things on the earth" (Colossians 3:2).

Jesus also taught us that God's Kingdom has precedence even over the necessities of life (Matthew 6:25-32). Throughout the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus consistently emphasized the fruitlessness of anxiety about necessities (Matthew 6:25, 27, 28, 31, 34). If we are to seek God's Kingdom in preference to necessities, how much more should we seek the kingdom in preference to luxuries?

How does one seek the Kingdom first? Certainly, there must be a poverty of spirit (Matthew 5:3), along with a hunger and thirst for righteousness (Matthew 5:6). One must be willing to submit to God and obey His Word (Matthew 7:21-22). This means that worship assemblies are a priority, as well as other church activities. In one's personal life, Bible study and prayer are in the forefront. One makes up his mind to be Christ-like in every area of life.

Does it pay to put the Kingdom first? Yes, a thousand times, yes. Life on earth is brief, but eternity is forever.


