Following Christ

Jesus made one of the most profound statements when He declared: "I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me" (John 14:6). These three areas (the way, the truth, and the life) are worthy of our consideration.

First, Jesus is the way. Suppose a person is asked directions to a certain place. A person may give directions by saying turn right, go three, blocks, turn left at the first light, etc. However, a person could respond: "Follow me, I will lead you there." Jesus is saying that very thing: "Follow me." We need to follow Jesus because He is the way out of darkness, being the light of the world (John 8:12). Jesus said that anyone who follows Him will not abide in darkness (John 12:46). In every aspect of life, Jesus is the way.

Also, Jesus is the truth. There is so much confusion in the world. People everywhere are saying: "No one can know the truth. Since no one can know the truth, there is no truth." Hence, they reason, we must follow our own feelings. To many people in modern-day society, propositional truth does not exist, and personal feelings are the only standard. Jesus stated that one could know the truth (John 8:31-32) and that the right relationship to the truth makes one free (John 8:32). The world says, "Truth does not exist," but Jesus said He is the truth, which implies following His Word (or teachings) (John 14:15; 15:14).

Not only is Jesus the way and the truth, but He is also the life. Our modern society is characterized by despondency and despair. People need direction for their lives (cf. Jeremiah 10:23), and Christ provides this. People also need hope in the face of death. Jesus is the resurrection and the life (John 11:25), and those who believe in Christ shall never die (John 11:26).

Following Jesus means there is a sure direction (the way), a solid foundation (the truth), and a glorious hope (the life). When we follow Jesus, we gain the ultimate victory, and our Savior will lead us to our heavenly Father.
