Man is able to build great cities, work on complex machines, make fantastic scientific discoveries, and produce useful communication devices, because he has a useful body. Our bodies enable us to learn about the Lord and to do His will.

We thank God for our physical bodies and realize that we have a responsibility to take care of them (I Corinthians 6:19-20). May an examination of our human body cause us to be thankful to our heavenly Father and to be more determined to be like Him.
