# When You Are Wronged

When someone does wrong to us, there is a tremendous temptation to exact some kind of vengeance on the person. The idea of "I'll get even with you" often translates into "Not only will I get even, I'll make you pay." Sometimes, this goes so far as "I'll make you pay double (or triple) for what you've done." For the Christian, a different standard is in play.

First, all vengeance belongs to God. Paul told the Roman saints, "Vengeance is mine; I will repay, saith the Lord" (Romans 12:19). Taking vengeance on wrongdoers belongs to God. When Paul gave his parting words to Timothy, he stated, "Alexander the coppersmith did me much evil: the Lord reward him according to his works" (II Timothy 4:14). This does not mean that one should let wrongdoers walk all over you. Paul also added about Alexander, "Of whom be thou ware also; for he hath greatly withstood our words" (II Timothy 4:15). In warning Timothy of Alexander, Paul was showing that one could be wary of a false brother and still leave the vengeance up to God.

Second, the idea of an "eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth" (Exodus 21:23-25; Leviticus 24:20; Deuteronomy 19:21) was not so much for vengeance as for limitation. While certainly there is the element of justice (i.e. punishment for injury), the real reason for an "eye for an eye" is to limit the person who had been wronged. The tendency among people is to punish in a greater measure than the original injury. God was limiting the Israelites in dealing with injuries and injustices. One could only punish one with an "eye for an eye or a tooth for a tooth." If a man had lost a tooth in some way due to someone's misdeed, he was not allowed to knock three or four out of the guilty party.

Third, since all vengeance belongs to God, we must keep in mind that His punishment is greater than anything we could possibly do or imagine. Any attempt at exacting punishment pales in comparison to eternal torment. God's ways are always greater than man's.

Let us always remember that God is a God of justice, and no sin or wrongdoing escapes His all-seeing eyes. We may not see the punishment in this life, but God assures us, wickedness will not go unpunished.
