Things That Do Not Change

So much of our world is changing. There are new technologies almost every day. Cell phones that were cutting-edge innovations a couple of years ago are now almost obsolete. Countries and politics are constantly changing in leadership and policies. In the world of religion, there has been a tremendous amount of change. At one time, most of our nation respected the Bible and at least gave lip-service to its authority and place in society. Those ideas have long been discarded. Morality has changed so much that it seems we are replaying the statement of long ago: "Every man did that which was right in his own eyes" (Judges 21:25). What we need to do is recognize that there are some things that do not change.

First, God does not change. While it is true that the Lord has changed His covenants throughout the ages and the specifics in each covenant, God Himself has not changed. His basic nature of love, justice, and mercy will never change.

Second, God's requirement of faith has never changed. In the Patriarchal Age, the fathers were God's means of communication. In the Mosaic Age, Moses and various prophets and national leaders were the Lord's agents of communication. In the Christian Age. God speaks through Christ, the apostles, and inspired writers. Even though the spokesmen for God have changed in every age, our heavenly Father has always demanded faith (cf. Hebrews 11:1-40). All people from the beginning of time have been required to believe and therefore obey God's voice.

Third, God's requirement of obedience has not changed. While it is the case that penalties for sin have changed (we no longer stone people), the basic demand for obedience has never changed. Mankind's rebellion to God's Word rationalizes that man does not need to heed the Lord's commandments. However, there simply is no way for people to show their love and respect for God without adhering to His instructions (cf. John 14:15).

In our world, we never know what new thoughts, teachings, or gadgets will appear. However, it is comforting to know that our loving heavenly Father will not change, and His basic way of dealing with man (through faith and obedience) will not change either.
