Handling God's Truth

The apostle Paul wrote to Timothy: "Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth" (II Timothy 2:15). The phrase "rightly dividing" literally means in Greek "cutting a straight line." It is also translated "handling aright," "rightly handling," or "correctly handles." The point is that Timothy needed to handle God's Word properly. There are several lessons from this passage.

We must see that there is a danger: one can improperly handle God's Word. If there is no danger, the admonition is meaningless. We must be aware that Peter also warned that Scripture can be "wrested" or "twisted" (II Peter 3:16). Paul also stated that God's Word could be handled deceitfully (II Corinthians 4:20). We must always be careful because there is the possibility of mishandling God's Word.

We should also see that while we can mishandle the Word of God, we can also properly handle God's Word. This begins by respecting the Scriptures as the Word of God (I Thessalonians 2:13). The Scriptures are the Word of God because they are inspired by God (II Timothy 3:16-17). To handle God's Word properly, we must also understand that the Word is a "discerner" of the heart (Hebrews 4:12). The word "discerner" really means "critic" and shows the power of God's Word to point out errors, both doctrinally and morally.

To handle God's Word correctly means several things. First, we must understand the distinction between the Old and New Testament. We must know that the law has been changed (Hebrews 7:12) and that the first covenant has been taken away (Hebrews 10:9-10). Second, we must accept all that God has spoken on a subject. Jesus said, "Again, it is written" (Matthew 4:1-11). Third, we must understand symbolic language in light of literal language. Symbolic language, such as the book of Revelation, must not nullify literal language.

As children of God, we must always use God's Word in a proper way. May God help us to always do this.
