Dealing with Selfishness

Hardly anyone would deny the enormous problem of selfishness in our world today. The self-centeredness of so many people affects almost every aspect of society. Homes are ruined by selfishness, businesses sometimes flounder because of selfish employees, and many governments are at a standstill because of the selfish attitudes and actions of some of their leaders and citizens.

The Bible has much to say on this important subject. Paul taught the Roman brethren: "For even Christ pleased not himself" (Romans 15:3). Paul also urged the Corinthian saints: "Let not man seek his own, but every man another's wealth" (I Corinthians 10:24). He further instructed the Corinthian brethren by saying about Christ: "He died for all, that they which live should not henceforth live unto themselves, but unto him which died for them, and rose again" (II Corinthians 5:15). The inspired apostle told the Philippian brethren: "Look not every man on his own things, but every man also on the things of others" (Philippians 2:4). Paul warned Timothy that in the last days "Men shall be lovers of selves" (II Timothy 3:2). James asked a haunting question when he wrote: "If a brother or sister be naked and destitute of daily food, and one of you say unto them, depart in peace, be ye warmed and filled: not withstanding ye give them not those things which are needful of the body: what doth it profit?" (James 2:15-16). The apostle John wrote a similar question when he asked: "But whoso hath this world's goods, and seeth his brother have need, and shutteth up his bowels of compassion from him, how dwelleth the love of God in him?" (I John 3:17)

Everything about God shows how wrong selfishness is. God was not selfish when He gave His one and only Son. Christ was not selfish when He gave His life on Calvary. The Holy Spirit was not selfish when He inspired the writing of the Bible. The early church was not selfish when they sold their lands and houses to meet the needs of their brethren.

There is a sense of self-esteem and self-worth that the Scriptures teach. Since we are to "love our neighbors as ourselves" (Matthew 22:39), we must have a good sense of self-love or self-worth. However, the devil has twisted this good sense of self-love and caused many people to become selfish.

We should all remember: "Love seeketh not its own" (I Corinthians 13:5).
